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## European lumber and glulam import increased

Competitive prices with KD size accuracy stimulate demand

Import of kiln dried European softwood lumber and structural glulam has been consistently increasing. The total demand for wood in Japan is in slump due to depressed housing starts but to improve housing quality, shift to use higher performance building materials from usual lumber continues.

For the first half of this year, total import of European softwood products was 1,236 M cbms, which was 12.2% higher than the same period of last year.

Meanwhile lumber import from North America dropped by 14-1% to 1,960 M cbms so the difference narrowed between those two. However, Euro turned stronger recently after long weak trend, which restrains import somewhat so explosive growth of European lumber import for last several years seems to slow down. With slow demand in Europe, the suppliers continue to push sales for Japan as Japan prices are better than depressed European prices.

Glulam import is particularly growing higher. Many local and franchised builders now use more glulam to cope with the new Hoising Quality Assurance law and Housing Performance Labeling System.

Total import of glulam in the first half of the year was record high of 271,675 cbms, 31.2% increase over the same period of last year. By source, Germany, which products are primarily marketed by Kullick and Rullmann took the top from Austria. Its volume for Japan almost tripled. The second was Finland, where FLT and Novalam are

The second was Finland, where FLT and Novalam are aggressively expanding export volume. Canada, which is ranked fifth now surpassed U.S.A. China was seventh whose volume increased more than three times after large mills for Japan started operating such as Dulien Global Group.
